# The Ideal Applicant

The ideal curate is a spiritually grounded, mission-minded leader who desires to grow as a priest in the Anglican tradition, while actively contributing to the work of resetting and revitalizing churches. All Saints is looking for someone who:

- Has completed or is completing seminary and is ordained (or ordainable) in the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA).
- Is deeply motivated by a sense of call, demonstrating resilience, emotional stability, and the ability to persevere through pressure and challenge.
- Is a self-aware individual, able to build and sustain trust across generations, cultures, and faith backgrounds, including those unchurched and spiritually curious.
- Values teamwork and shared leadership, empowering others, recognizing giftedness, and avoiding a "solo ministry" approach.
- Is flexible, adaptable, and responsive to context, able to adjust methods while remaining faithful to Scripture and the mission of the Church.
- Demonstrates a heart for evangelism and discipleship.
- If married, enjoys the full support of their spouse in both calling and tradition, cultivating a healthy and unified marriage.

We invite candidates to respond with prayerful honesty. These questions help us discern a cultural fit and readiness for the position of curate at All Saints:

## **Personal & Spiritual Formation**

- 1. Briefly share your spiritual autobiography. Include how you came to know Christ, your baptism, and significant moments of encounter with God.
- 2. Describe your current spiritual life: disciplines, worship, community, and what you need for continued growth in Christ.

#### **Calling & Vocational Readiness**

- 3. Describe your call to the ordained ministry.
- 4. What types of pastoral ministry do you feel drawn to?

## Character & Capacity

- 5. Describe a time you served under authority. How do you handle feedback, and accountability?
- 6. Share an example of a time you had to adapt to change or overcome a significant challenge. What did you learn.

#### **Theological Alignment**

- 7. The All Saints' Curacy program is within the Diocese of Fort Worth (ACNA). Please review the Website of the Diocese which contains a *Resources* page on which you will find *Essays on the Ordination of Women*. Are you willing to fully embrace the stance of the Diocese?
- 8. Please write a brief description of the gospel that you might offer to an unchurched but curious person.

## Spouse's Reflection (if married)

If married, please have your wife respond to the following:

- 9. Do you agree with and support your spouse's sense of calling to ordained ministry?
- 10. Are you of one heart and mind regarding your spouse's choice of Anglican Christianity?
